Efficiency isn't about speed alone; it's about reducing friction and fragility.

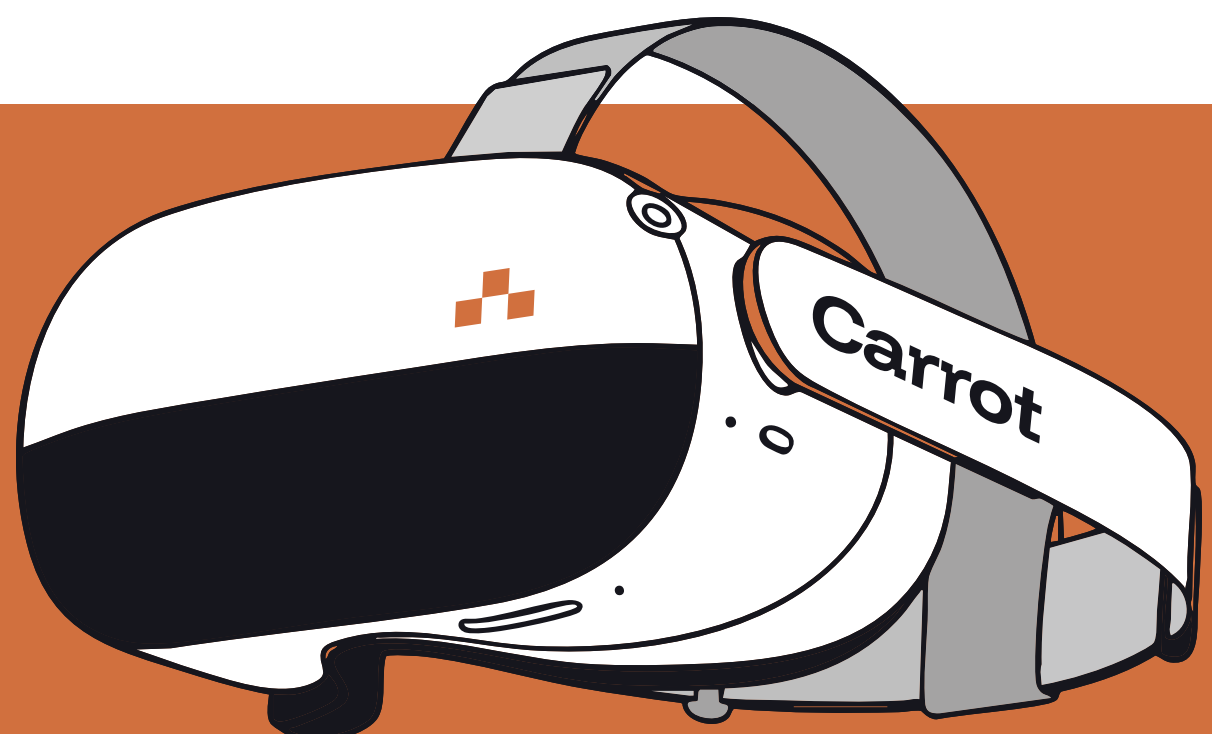
PATIENT EXPERIENCE DESIGNED IN, NOT ADDED ON
